Crosstabulation Results

Methodology:

This poll was conducted between March 3-March 5, 2023 among a sample of 2203 Adults. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Adults based on age, gender, race, educational attainment, region, gender by age, and race by educational attainment. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 2 percentage points.
